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INTRODUCTION

Symposium discusses in Salvador attention, care and technological innovations for sickle cell disease

The VII Brazilian Symposium on Sickle Cell Disease (SCD) will take place from 20 to 23 November 2013 in Salvador, in the Convention Center of Bahia. It continues with the integrated, multi-professional and multidisciplinary actions of the Ministry of Health (MS) within the care, attention and technological innovations normalized in the Unified Health System (SUS), aimed at people with SCD.

SCD is one of the most common genetic and hereditary disease in the world, with large incidence in Brazil. It is a genetic mutation that occurred in the African continent and that arrived in Brazil due to the sad story of African people brought here for slavery work. For its large incidence in this country, since 2005, the Ministry of Health (MS) developed a National Policy on Comprehensive Care for People with SCD, fulfilling a longstanding demand of the black movement, and established it in the SUS by ordinance GM / GAB No. 1,361, of August 16, 2005. The policy is implemented around the country by the Sickle Cell Disease Technical Advisor Team (ATDF), from the General Coordination of Blood and Blood Products (CGSH), that is linked to the Department of Specialized Care (DAE), in the Secretariat of Health Care (SAS).

Promoted by MS, in partnership with the University of Bahia (UFBA) and the State Secretariat of Health of Bahia (SESAB), this symposium takes place at an appropriate time due to the fact that the attention model that is advocated in it is being cited as an international reference. With multidisciplinary and multi-professional nature, it will address the theme that nowadays is essential to the improvement of care - the technological innovations that can offer people with SCD longevity with quality of life.

Besides international speakers and guests from Africa, where the disease originated, the symposium will be attended by the SUS workers and representatives of associations of people with SCD from all the Brazilian states, being this last aspect of great importance, because the user is the filter improvement in the implementation of the policy.

This symposium is held every two years in a different capital city and it is currently prioritized by CGSH to the Northeastern capitals, for that is the region with the highest incidence of the disease. This year the symposium is back to Salvador, capital of the state of Bahia, that has the higher incidence of SCD in Brazil. This is the place where it was created through the initiative of a group of experts who devoted themselves to the study of the disease in Brazil, and where it grew to be taken on by the MS.

The choice of Salvador has yet another reason: the city hosts the UFBA Center of Orthopedics and Traumatology of the *Hospital das Clinicas*, which is the hospital of the School of Medicine. The hospital maintains in partnership with the MS a center of studies and researches in the field of cell therapy in bone and skin lesions in SCD, which treats people from Bahia and from many other states.

The opening of the symposium will take place on the Day of Black Consciousness -November 20, in which Brazil pays respect to Zumbi dos Palmares, black hero that died in 1695, fighting against racism. It is a very significant day for the black movement and, of course, for people with SCD. This is a segment of the national population with which the country has a huge social debt. Africans and their descendants contributed to the formation of Brazil. The adoption of compensatory policies is a way to redeem the debt. It is this mater that, with great pride, this symposium is devoted to.

SUBMISSION OF SCIENTIFIC PAPERS

Deadline for submission of proposals

From June 30 registrations will be open for submission of scientific papers or experience reports, authored individually or collectively, in the knowledge field of Hemoglobinopathies / Comprehensive Care for People with Sickle Cell Disease. Deadline for submissions is September 30, 2013.

Entries must comply with the following guiding principles:

- 1. Care / Clinic
- 2. Public Policy, Planning and Management
- 3. Teaching and Research
- 4. Significant Experiences
- 5. Innovations in SUS
- 6. Participation and Social Control in SUS

General Instructions

- Papers must be submitted online, on the website of the Symposium, in the participant restricted area. It is also through that area that the approval process of the paper must be verified.
- All papers must include title, main author, co-authors, institution, abstract, indication of theme and sub-theme, name and address of the submitter. The submitting author must be registered in the Symposium.
- Only unpublished papers can be submitted. Papers can be related to theses, dissertations, teaching or research projects in progress or completed in the last two years (2011-2013); and reports on significant experiences related to the fields indicated above, completed in the last two years (2011-2013).

Paper formatting

All papers must contain a short abstract in accordance with the following indications:

- Caracter type: Times New Roman, size 12, with a space of 1.5 between lines;
- Paper margins: 2.5 cm on top, bottom, right and left;
- The total content of the abstract should contain up to 2,500 characters (including spaces and excluding title, author and institution);
- Do not include graphics, tables and photos.

BANNERS

Banners must contain:

- Title
- Author (authors)
- Institution (s) of author (s), in abbreviated form
- Introduction
- Objectives
- Methodology
- Results (preliminary or final)
- Conclusions
- References

The final banner must be printed in the following format:

- Dimensions 90 x 100 cm with a unique layout, containing the name of the event at the top and the institutions supporting the base;
- References should be included.

ORAL PRESENTATION

Criteria for selection of papers for oral presentation:

The Scientific Committee will select papers among all submitted for Oral Communication, according to its internal criteria. The remaining papers stay in the poster category.

In addition to complying with the requirements of explicit summaries of General Instructions, the process of evaluation and selection of papers follows the following criteria:

1. Relevance, innovation level (new applications / contribution to existing knowledge) and contemporaneity;

2. Theoretical consistency of the approached object and its relation to the theme and / or its coverage, methodological rigor.

3. Characteristics of the submitted abstract with respect to organization, synthesis capacity and clarity of presentation;

4. Inter-institutional, inter-sectoral and multidisciplinary Efforts, and of Social Control and Participation in the SUS.

5. Products, results, or arguments approaches and their effective contribution to the development of knowledge about the Haemoglobinopathies / Comprehensive Care for People with Sickle Cell Disease.

6. Contribution to the development of Care for People with Sickle Cell Disease.

Evaluation results

The deadline for the announcement of results is August 30, 2013. Authors can check the status of their work by accessing the restricted area, according to the General Instructions. In time, date, time and location of each presentation of Posters and Oral Communication will be communicated to the authors.

Presentation of Papers

The papers selected as banners will be exposed in reserved areas in date, time and place to be indicated by the Scientific Committee.

The papers selected for Oral Communication will be presented in accordance with the overall planning of the Symposium, with ten (10) minutes of presentation reserved for each author and (05) five minutes dedicated for debates after the presentations. Date, time and place will be set by the Scientific Committee.

Final recommendations

By proposing a paper, participants agree to the following conditions:

- Oral communication will be presented exclusively by one of the authors;
- In case of withdrawal, it is requested that the participant of the Symposium to inform the Secretariat by November 1, 2013, via e-mail, so that other paper can be invited to present in its place.
- Certificates of presentation of papers (banner and / or oral communication) will be issued by the organization.
- Missed cases shall be decided by the Scientific Committee, whose decisions are final.
